OUR FORTHCOMING PRODUCTIONS



Following the success of 'The Lady in the Van', we will be staging three of Alan Bennett's 'Talking Heads' this autumn.

Of the six that are available for stage performance, we will be presenting three. different Three verv characters living or reliving

their memories and experiences as each remembers them.

In the first, 'A cream cracker under the settee', we see an elderly lady, aware of causing her own situation but perhaps unaware that it derives from both her obsessive nature and determination.

The second, 'Her big chance', features Lesley, a young aspiring actress who believes she has much to offer, both as a person and especially as an actress with 'stardom' in her sites.

'Lady of letters', the third story concerns Miss Ruddock who writes copious letters. She regards herself as public spirited in the comments she makes. This appears to be her downfall but is it? Our first production of 2018 will be 'A Bunch of Amateurs' by Ian Hislop and Nick Newman, directed and produced by Nigel and Amanda Rowe.

Ageing, fading Hollywood action hero Jefferson Steele arrives in England to play King Lear in Stratford only to find it is not Stratford on Avon the home of the Bard but sleepy Stratford St John in Suffolk. Instead of Dame Judi and Kenneth Branagh he has a cast of amateurs trying to save their theatre from developers. His enormous ego, vanity and insecurity are thus tested to the limit by a very enthusiastic bunch of amateurs as acting worlds collide and his career implodes.

As a film, it was chosen for the 2008 Royal Film performance which the Queen so enjoyed she requested a special showing at Sandringham for Christmas.

The cast consists of 3 Men 4 Women.

A read through will be held at the theatre on Tuesday 3rd October and auditions be on Tuesday 17th October. On both evenings we will commence at 7.30pm in the Manifest bar. Production dates will be Tuesday 20th to Saturday 24th February.

MANIFEST MOVIES FILM NIGHTS

Our next film, 'August Rush', a 2007 American drama film directed by Kirsten Sheridan, will be shown on Friday the 15th September.

It is the story of an 11-year-old musical prodigy living in an orphanage who runs away to

New York City. He begins to unravel the mystery of who he is. All the while his mother is searching for him and his father is searching for her.

The many different sounds and rhythms he hears throughout



his journey culminate in a major instrumental composition which concludes the film - August's Rhapsody.

On Friday 6th October the Frankenberg Partnership will host a Film Night at the Manifest Theatre. The film is 'The Lives of Others' (in German with English sub titles) which won an Oscar for Best Foreign Language Film in 2007 and European Film Award for Best Picture.

It is a powerful drama depicting the terrifying presence of the Stasi in East Berlin. The film is full of suspense and intrigue that will keep you on the edge of your seat and the characters will linger long after you have left the theatre. PG15.
