There is no examination, but students will be assessed during the course and an Attendance Certificate will be issued to those who prove satisfactory in this subject. :-

- 5. Contents of a First Aid box

- 9. Injuries to bones and joints
- 10. Defibrillation.

Calendar Girls is based on a true story about a group of women from a Women's Institute group in Yorkshire who raised funds for their local hospital's cancer unit in memory of their friend John. 'They offer support for anyone who had been newly diagnosed, throughout any treatment and after treatment has ended".
