MANIFEST MOVIES FILM NIGHTS

Our next film, 'Touching The Void' will be shown on 19th January. It's a true story of two climbers and their perilous journey up the west face of Siula Grande in the Peruvian Andes in 1985.

An electrifyingly thrilling movie directed by Kevin Macdonald that makes the mountain more than a setting, almost another character in the story. The sheerness of the slope, the friable "meringues" and "cornices" of snow, the sweep and sparkle of the ice – the mountain's terrible beauty is alternately austere, majestic, implacable, ominous, and menacing.

Doors and bar open at 7pm on film nights. Films begin at 7.45pm. Pay on the door. Tickets are just £5 for Manifest Theatre members. Non members pay additional £2 annual theatre membership. This entitles them to reduced prices on all Manifest productions during the year.

A MUSICAL FOR THE AUTUMN

Our Autumn production this year will be The Matchgirls, a musical by Bill Owen and Tony Russell about the London matchgirls strike of 1888.

The musical focuses on the lifestyle of the match cutters at the Bryant and May factory in Bow, London, with strong references to the condition Phossy Jaw and the political climate of the era. With much of the action set in the incongruously named, but fictional, 'Hope Court', the musical portrays Bryant and May as callous and uncaring employers, with factory foreman 'Mr Mynel' representing the threatening and imposing regime in which the girls were forced to work.

Despite the subject matter of the musical, a strong emphasis is placed on the positive mentality and natural ebullience of the so-called 'cockney sparrows', this leading to a number of cheerful and entertaining vocal numbers and dance routines.

There will be a read through on the 23rd July followed by auditions on 25th.

Performance dates: 23rd to 27th October.

PARKING AT THE MANIFEST

We do understand that parking close to the theatre can be a problem but we must politely remind all members that parking on the forecourt is for those with reduced mobility (6 spaces) and we also ask that people do not park in Oxford Road itself as parking is already limited for our neighbours and this can make things very difficult for them.

The best places to park are

- New Road - on the East side, just a short walk down Norman Rd or Oxford Rd to the theatre.
- High Street - the few spaces between Townsend's and The Crown.
- Quay Street - at the sailing club end

From the High St there is a pedestrian path from Stour Street to Malthouse Rd, then to Oxford Rd. To help you there is a map on our website - www.manifesttheatre.co.uk/about_map.shtml. We really appreciate your help and understanding with this issue.
